


This letter is to thank you and your organization for your assistance and support in improving the health of the people of Meru, Kenya and more so in the fight against malaria.

Malaria is the number one cause of morbidity and mortality in Meru Central District. Malaria accounts for over 37% of all out-patient conditions. It affects all age groups and it is most severe among pregnant women and children under the age of five. Among pregnant women, it is one of the leading causes of miscarriages, premature birth, and low birth weight.

Through the support of Answer Africa, we have received and distributed 129,059 insecticide treated mosquito nets to various groups of the population that include rural communities, schools, hospitals, and pregnant women and children under the age of five.

This distribution of treated mosquito nets has resulted in a 34% reduction in the malaria burden in Meru Central District. Ministry Of Health statistics from December 2007 through April 2008 show that there have been 55,874 fewer cases of malaria equating to this 34% reduction.

This support has also contributed to the success in the overall reduction of malaria in Kenya through the use of mosquito nets, a strategy that has won commendation from the World Health Organization (WHO).

The individuals and families of the beneficiaries of these nets are very grateful and sincerely thank you.

Meru District has from November 2007 to December 2008 received a total of 112,698 Mosquito nets through assistance of Answer Africa.

DISTRIBUTION

3,500 of these nets have been given to squatters in Timau and Ex-lewa areas, **3,700** to widows, orphans and people living with HIV/Aids. Another **1,650** were distributed to destitute children through the District Children Officer. Other **100,145** nets were distributed through 21 health clinics as follows:-

Another consignment of **3,180** nets were received and distributed to all major hospitals in Meru Central, Meru North, Tharaka, Chuka, Embu and Mbeere Districts to be used in hospital beds.

During this December, we have also received 7,753 nets and another consignment of 7,770 nets which we are in the process of distributing before the end of this year. This brings the total number of nets received from November 2007 to end of December 2008 to 117, 688 nets. Of the Dec. 2008 consignment,10,000 nets were distributed through the 20 Clinics shown above, 523 nets were given to people in the remand/juvenile homes and 5,000 nets given to Children of ten Primary schools in remote areas of the district where there are no health clinics.

Through this support, Malaria morbidity and mortality has greatly reduced and the health of the Meru people in particular and the Kenya in general have greatly been improved through the assistance from Answer Africa.

We look forward to working together in realizing our goal of making malaria history.

(a) Donated 67,254 mosquito nets to 21 Health Facilities in Meru District Hospital's jurisdiction.

- 54,769 of these mosquito nets are pre-treated (3-year lifespan) and designated to be distributed to pregnant women and their children under 5 years of age.
- 12,485 mosquito nets are designated to be pre-treated (3-year lifespan) and delivered to vulnerable patients, i.e. the old, HIV+ and hospital ward beds.

About 1250 pregnant Women attend MCH clinics in a month.

The population of children under five years in the District is estimated at 70,265.
